Dr. Tatkin received his early training in developmental object relations, Gestalt, psychodrama, and family systems theory. Over the last decade, his interests have shifted to neurodevelopmental theories of relationship, integrating principles of early infant-mother attachment with adult romantic relationships. He has trained in the Adult Attachment Interview with Mary Main, is an experienced Vipassana Meditation facilitator, and a veteran of Allan Schore's Study Group. Dr. Tatkin maintains a private practice in Calabasas, California specializing in couples psychotherapy and training clinicians in his unique method of practice.
